This being said, there is a limit to our scholarship fund.

1. Please share with us your goals for attending the program.
2. What do you hope to gain from the experience?
3. What are some other ways you could raise funds for this course?
4. The scholarship amount you are requesting.
5. Include your contact information including email, phone and mailing address.

We will review your request and send you a response in a timely manner. In general we offer scholarships of up to 30% off the full tuition rate. The course tuitions can be found at the top of each course description page. We ask that you assess your needs and choose an amount that works for you, and includes a personally significant contribution from you.

In return for the scholarship, we require all recipients to commit to two things after their course to help us raise funds for future scholarship recipients:

- Write a letter to our donors sharing their course experience with them.
- Spend 1 day of their time helping us get the word out about our programs. This could be posting flyers, making phone calls or emailing all your contacts about your experience.
